Case Synopsis:

On October 23, 2010, Boulware was stopped for a traffic offense by officer Tyler. She was arrested for Driving Under the Influence and her blood tested at .141 % by weight BAC (Blood Alcohol Content). Boulware was placed on probation.

While on probation, Boulware was arrested by the Iowa State Patrol on several offenses involving her non-payment of Iowa fines and her driving without a valid license. On July 15, 2013 Boulware was arrested by the Sioux City Police Department for a DUI 4th offense, careless, interference with official acts, fraudulent use of a registration and no insurance. Ms. Boulware admitted to violating her probation.

Sentencing Synopsis:

On a probation violation, the Court is able to resentence a defendant up to the maximum amount allowed under the original sentence. In this case the Court resented Boulware to serve sixty days in the Union County Jail and that following her sentence she is to be released to Iowa to address her punishment there where they have the most recent and most serious crime. The Court further cited that it would be inefficient to have two state's monitoring Boulware on probation. The Court further ordered that Walker must pay all fines, court costs, prosecution costs, and court-appointed attorney fees.

Criminal History Synopsis:

This is Boulware's second felony conviction with a pending and potential third felony offense charged in Iowa.
