### Case Synopsis:

Court Service Officer, Kelly Gregg was conduct home visits with some of her probationer on August 13, 2013 when she went to the residence shared by Denise Dodds and Tanner Rasmussen. Gregg found both Dodds and Rasmussen in a detached garage smoking synthetic marijuana (generic street name of K2) which was tested and later determined to contain UR-144 and / or XLR-11 which are schedule 1 controlled substances. Gregg called the North Sioux City Police Department to respond to her location. Both were arrested and because they were on probation, they were required to provide a urine sample. Both Dodds and Rasmussen tested positive for the UR-144 and / or XLR-11.

### Sentencing Synopsis:

On the charge of Possession of Controlled Substance in file 11-100, the Court resentenced Rasmussen to a two year suspended sentence to the South Dakota State Penitentiary. The Court further stated that this sentence would be consecutive to file 13-246. The Court further ordered that Rasmussen would be on supervised probation for two years. The Court Ordered that Rasmussen must spend thirty days in the Union County Jail starting on December 16, 2013 at 9:00 a.m. Work release was granted to Rasmussen. Rasmussen must pay all unpaid fines, court costs, prosecution costs, and previous and new court-appointed attorney fees.

On the charge of Ingestion of a Schedule I or II Controlled Substance in file 13-246, the Court resentenced Rasmussen to a five year suspended sentence to the South Dakota State Penitentiary. The Court further stated that this sentence would be consecutive to file 11-100. The Court further ordered that Rasmussen would be on supervised probation for four years. Rasmussen must pay all fines, court costs, prosecution costs, and court-appointed attorney fees.

### Criminal History Synopsis:

This is Tanner Rasmussen's second career felony conviction.
