Case Synopsis:

Law enforcement investigated the second-degree burglary of a North Sioux City residence that occurred on September 16, 2013, again on September 18, 2013 and a third time on September 20, 2013. On September 20, 2013, officer Don Eagleman responded to the residence and found Jerod Price inside the residence and arrested Price as he was leaving out the back door with stolen items from the residence. In an interview with Jerod Price, he admitted all three burglaries at the same residence. This residence is his parents' residence. Due to issues in Jerod's life and his persistent issue, Jerod's parents had kicked Jerod out of the house.

Jerod was living with his girlfriend's parent's house prior to offense, however, Mr. Price knew that he had a warrant out for his arrest and chose to be homeless during the time of the three burglaries to avoid detection by law enforcement.

- On September 18, 2013, Jerod Price with the assistance of Jordan James and returned to James' residence. James and Price removed the safe and several other items with an approximate value of \$3,553.99. This amount also included several firearms. (File number 13-315)

Sentencing Synopsis:

On the charge of Aiding and Abetting Grand Theft, a class six felony, the Court granted James a suspended imposition of sentence and placed James on supervised probation for three years. The Court further ordered that James must pay all, restitution, fines, court costs, prosecution costs, and court-appointed attorney fees.

Criminal History Synopsis:

This is Jordan James's first felony conviction.
