### Case Synopsis:

On January 29, 2014 at about 3:25 p.m., Officer Don Eaglemann was responded to a possible burglary in progress call at a storage facility in North Sioux City. Two employees for the business that also manages the storage facility reported that they could hear what sounded like someone cutting metal in a locked storage building. When Officer Eaglemann arrived he could also hear cutting noises coming from inside of the storage facility. After Officer Eaglemann called for Officer Derrick McIntosh to assist, they entered into the building and found Frank Feese in the act of cutting a valve off of a metal pipe. The police ordered Feese to stop and arrested him. Feese had in his possession the following burglary tools: a hacksaw; metal shears; five bags to carry items away with; a flash light; and a screw driver. Feese had removed five metal valves from the interior of the building and had them collected together in his possession. The property was well maintained and every entrance to this building was secured and locked. It is believed that Feese gained entry to the facility through the roof.

### Sentencing Synopsis:

On the charge of Possession of Burglary Tools with the Intent to commit a Burglary, Frank Feese was sentenced to serve two (2) years in the South Dakota State Penitentiary with the sentence to begin immediately. To pay all court fees and fines, and to also to remain in custody of the Union County Sheriff's office until he can be transported to the South Dakota State Penitentiary at their earliest opportunity. Shortly after his sentencing here in Union County, Feese was sentenced to serve five years in the Iowa State Penitentiary which could be run concurrent with South Dakota's Sentence. Upon the request of the Feese and his attorney, the Court in the South Dakota case modified the order to allow Feese to serve his time in Iowa concurrent with Iowa's time. Feese was transferred into the custody of the Woodbury County Sheriff's office and transferred to the Iowa state penitentiary.

### Criminal History:

This is Frank Feese's fourteenth career felony conviction.
