Case Synopsis:

Law enforcement investigated the reports of several vehicles having been entered on or about May 10th, 2015. Several witnesses identified the occupants of the vehicle as Collin Full and Trevor McCabe. Law enforcement interviewed each separately and both admitted to the theft of various items from multiple vehicles. Both Full and McCabe admitted to the theft of property valued at one thousand and seventy-five dollars. However, law enforcement could only identify victims for nine hundred and eighteen dollars worth of property. Due to the fact that all of the property was unable to be associated with a victim, the felony charges were downgraded by the state in a plea agreement offer to each defendant to a misdemeanor charges. Collin Full entered a guilty plea to the three charges stated above.

Sentencing Synopsis:

The Court ordered in each charge listed above that Collin Full be placed on un-supervised probation for a term of three hundred and sixty days. The Court further ordered that Collin Full to pay the following within three hundred and sixty days:

- \$84.00 in Court Costs on each charge (or \$252.00 in Court Costs);
- \$500.00 in fines on each charge (or \$1,500.00 in fines);
- \$458.00 in restitution as this defendant's share of the total restitution;

Criminal History:

Collin Full received a suspended imposition of sentence from the court. This means that upon Mr. Full completing his un-supervised probation and paying all of his financial obligations the Court will grant the suspension of the judgment. The effect of this will be as if Mr. Full was never convicted of these crimes and his record will no reflect a conviction. However, if Mr. Full does fails to be a law abiding citizen for the term of three hundred and sixty days and or he fails to pay all of his obligations, this sentence may be converted to a Judgment and will there after remain on his permanent record. Mr. Full did not have a felony record or he would not qualify for the Court's suspended imposition of sentence.
