Original Case Synopsis:

On January 14, 2013 while trying to get gas at Coffee Cup Truck Stop at the intersection of SD Hwy 50 and I-29 Maclean was observed by an employee as being unable to figure out how to operate the gas pump. The employee offered Maclean assistance and in doing so smelled the odor of marijuana and saw marijuana on the seat in the car. The employee called law enforcement and South Dakota Highway Patrol Officer Heurtz responded. Officer Heurtz immediately detected the strong odor of marijuana coming from Maclean's person. Officer Heurtz conducted a probable cause search of Maclean's car and located marijuana and paraphernalia in the vehicle. Maclean was then escorted to the Union County Jail where a field sobriety test was administered, Maclean failed resulting in a DUI (under the influence of drugs) charge.

PV # 1 & 2 Synopsis:

Alexander Maclean was arrested on October 28, 2013 for the offense of 3rd Degree burglary. During the burglary investigation Maclean was found to be in possession of a controlled substance, which is in violation of the terms and conditions of his probation. Law Enforcement required that Maclean submit to a drug testing, however Maclean refused to cooperate, which is another violation of his probation. Later, Maclean advised his court service

officer that he had ingested methamphetamines. The Court found Maclean to be in violation of the terms and conditions of his probation.

PV# 3 Synopsis:

Maclean has had the following issues while on probation since his last probation violation:

- On July 28, 2014, Maclean was arrested in Minnehaha County and charged with
 - Resisting Arrest,
 - Entering or Refusing to Leave, and
 - 2 counts of Disorderly Conduct.
- Maclean was also arrested on August 4, 2014, in Minnehaha County and charged with
 - Four (4) counts of Possession of a Controlled Substance,
 - Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and for
 - Being a habitual offender.
- Then on August 13, 2014, in Minnehaha County, Maclean was charged with
 - One (1) count of Possession of a Controlled Substance and
 - Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.
- The Maclean has not provided his Court Service Officer any proof of any employment as required as a condition of his probation.
- Maclean has changed his phone number and residence without notifying his Court Services Officer.
- Maclean has missed several appointments scheduled with his Court Services Officer.

PV# 4 Synopsis:

Maclean was ordered to complete a treatment program at Serenity Hills. Maclean reached this agreement on multiple files in Union, Lincoln, and Minnehaha Counties. Maclean was discharged from Serenity Hills as he failed to participate in the program, and for failing to assist in any way while enrolled in the program.

Sentencing Synopsis:

Maclean plead guilty to one count of possession of controlled substance a class 4 felony and one count of driving under the influence a class 1 misdemeanor. On the charge of possession of a controlled substance Maclean was sentenced to a suspended seven years sentence with five years of supervised probation. Maclean was ordered to serve 90 days in the Union County Jail for the misdemeanor DUI charge. Maclean's Court Services Officer has the discretion to waive any of the 90 days in Union County Jail if the Maclean is successfully completing his probation.

PV # 1 & 2 Sentencing Synopsis:

On the charge of possession of a controlled substance Alexander Maclean was resentenced to a suspended seven years sentence with four years of supervised probation. Maclean was ordered to serve 60 days in the Union County Jail with credit for the 20 days that Maclean spent in custody awaiting the final disposition of the probation violation. The court further ordered that Maclean pay all unpaid restitution, fines, court costs, and prosecution costs, as well as unpaid and new court-appointed attorney fees.

PV # 3 Sentencing Synopsis:

Alexander Maclean admitted to violating his terms and conditions of probation on October 27, 2014. On December 22, 2014 Alexander Maclean appeared before the court for the disposition of his case. On the class 4 felony charge of Possession of Schedule I or II Controlled Substance,

Alexander Maclean was re-sentenced to a suspended seven year sentence to the SD state penitentiary. The court ordered that Alexander Maclean satisfy five years of supervised probation and ordered that he spend one-hundred and eighty days in the union county jail with the balance of that time to be suspended on the terms and condition that he enters a treatment program. Alexander Maclean was financial obligations were re-imposed, as well as the additional financial obligations for the county having provided his legal representation throughout this process.

PV # 4 Sentencing Synopsis:

Alexander Maclean admitted to violating his terms and conditions of probation on September 14, 2015. On October 26, 2015 Alexander Maclean appeared before the court for the disposition of his case. On the class 4 felony charge of Possession of Schedule I or II Controlled Substance, Alexander Maclean was re-sentenced to a seven year sentence to the SD state penitentiary with three years suspended. Alexander Maclean was re-ordered to pay his financial obligations, as well as the additional financial obligations for the county having provided his legal representation throughout this process.

Criminal History:

This is Alexander Maclean fourth probation violation on his first felony conviction. Maclean has now been charged with seven felonies in his criminal career.
