Case Synopsis:

Since March of 2014 until December of 2014, Supri has not made a single payment towards his court-ordered financial obligations. On October 17, 2014 during a routine office appointment with her probation officer, Supri admitted to the continued use of methamphetamine. Due to this disclosure, Supri was instructed to obtain a drug addiction evaluation and start treatment. As of November 25, 2014 Supri identified that he had neither taken a drug evaluation nor started treatment at any facility. Since December of 2015, Supri stopped attending treatment.

Sentencing Synopsis:

The Court ordered a five-year sentence with one-year suspended. The Court ordered that Thomas Supri begin his sentence immediately. The Court ordered that Thomas Supri shall be given credit for the one-hundred and thirty-five days he spent incarcerated prior to disposition.

The Court further ordered that Thomas Supri pay his remaining unpaid financial obligations:

- Prosecution Costs;
- \$104.00 and Court Costs;
- \$500.00 in unpaid fines;
- \$45.00 to the South Dakota Drug Control Fund; and
- \$1,087.95 in Court Appointed Attorney Fees;

Criminal History:

This is Thomas Supri's second probation violation on first career felony conviction.
