Case Synopsis:

On December 5, 2015 Trooper Cody Jansen was running stationary radar on Interstate 29 at about 8:52 p.m. when Trooper Jansen could hear a vehicle approaching his location that obviously did not have a muffler attached. Markee admitted that he had failed to correctly install his exhaust system. A drug dog that was working the area did a perimeter search around the vehicle in which the drug dog indicated and alerted to Markee's vehicle. Christopher Everett was the front seat passenger with John Vital as the rear seat passenger.

Everett was found to have drug paraphernalia on his person. Markee had marijuana shake on his pants and on his driver's seat. Marijuana and paraphernalia was found under a seat and in a glove box.

Sentencing Synopsis:

The Court granted Christopher Everett was sentenced by the Court with a suspended five-year sentence with a term of four years of supervised probation. Everett was further ordered to serve 45 days in the Union County Jail with only 15 days suspended if Everett obtains his chemical dependency evaluation within 30 days of sentencing. Everett is required to report to serve his 30 days on June 1, 2017. The Court further ordered that Christopher Everett pay the following:

- \$500.00 in fines;
- \$104.00 in Court Costs;
- \$10.00 in Prosecution Costs; and
- \$267.00 in court-appointed attorney fees.

Criminal History:

This is Christopher Everett's first felony conviction, however, Everett's criminal history has several misdemeanor offenses.
