Case Synopsis:

The Sioux City Police Department detective, Jeff Harstad, called North Sioux City Chief of Police Richard Headid about a case that he was working on involving stolen checks from Triple D Construction that were cashed at Miller Liquor. Chief Headid followed up with the investigation, and was able to identify the clerk that took the forged check. The clerk remembered taking the check and remembered that she personally knew the person who passed the check. Chief Headid had contacted the Triple D Construction company and verified that Kandace Sanchez never worked at Triple D Construction. The payroll check that Sanchez passed at Miller Liquor was \$505.84

Sentencing Synopsis:

On December 7, 2015, the Court sentenced Kandace Sanchez to two years to the South Dakota State Penitentiary with her sentence to begin immediately. The Court further ordered that Sanchez pay \$104.00 in Court Costs; Prosecution costs \$10.00; \$690.00 in Court-Appointed Attorney Fees; and credit for the four days that she spent incarcerated prior to sentencing.

Criminal History:

This is Kandace Sanchez's seventh career felony conviction on her record.
