Case Synopsis:

On August 15, 2013 Colby Grant and Bryer Paul conspired to commit the crime of burglary and grand theft. Grant assisted Paul by driving Paul to and from the location of the burglary and by assisting in removing a 60-inch television from the residence into Grant's vehicle. Grant then drove Paul to a Sioux City pawnshop where Paul sold a 60-inch television. Paul then paid Grant for his assistance after they purchased some marijuana in Sioux City and smoked the marijuana together until they were intoxicated. When Grant was questioned by law enforcement he admitted to his cooperation with Paul. After cooperating with law enforcement, Grant warned Paul about his cooperation with law enforcement. Paul was arrested and after being convicted, Paul cooperated with law enforcement about the areas in which Grant lied to law enforcement about his cooperation in the burglary and grand theft.

Sentencing Synopsis:

Colby Grant received a sentence of Three Hundred Sixty (360) days in the Union County Jail with Two Hundred and Seventy (270) days suspended. Grant will be serving Ninety (90) days in the Union County Jail. The court further ordered Grant pay a five hundred dollar (\$500.00) fine in addition to his other obligations. The court further ordered that Grant to pay all, restitution, fines, court costs, and prosecution costs.

Motion to Revoke Suspended Sentence:

The State filed a motion to revoke Grant's suspended sentence to have the court impose the Two Hundred and Seventy days that was originally suspended because Grant had not made payments on his court ordered financial obligations. Grant admitted that he was in violation of the Court's sentencing order. The Court set an interim order that the Colby Grant pay Three Hundred Dollars on the day of the hearing and Two Hundred Dollars each month until the financial obligations are paid in full. The interim order advises that Grant is to be brought back in front of the court in the event that he fails to make the court ordered payments.
