Case Synopsis:

On August 29, 2016, stopped a U-Haul moving van traveling southbound on Interstate 29 at mile marker 34 within Union County. Joseph Robbins was the driver and Elizabeth Baker was the passenger. The officer pulled the vehicle over for a lane driving violation. ROBBINS did not have a valid license. ROBBINS and BAKER gave two different stories. The Trooper was given consent to search the U-Haul truck. During the search, the trooper found a large amount of crushed / ground marijuana in a coffee cans along with various marijuana pipes. On can contained 9.51 ounces of marijuana, and the other can contained 4.75 ounces of marijuana.

BAKER told law enforcement that she has never been in trouble before. BAKER stated that she did not know there was marijuana in the truck, however, she did admit that she used marijuana about one week prior to making this move. BAKER stated that when she last used marijuana that she rolled the marijuana into a joint. One of the cans that contained the marijuana also had a joint roller inside.

ROBBINS told law enforcement that he had only been in trouble for bad checks many years ago. A records check revealed that ROBBINS had been arrested for theft and forgery. ROBBINS claimed that they both loaded the U-Haul together. ROBBINS denied being a drug user and stated that he had not used cocaine for about 20 years now, and that he accidentally ate some marijuana infused brownies about two weeks prior to this stop.

Sentencing Synopsis:

On October 24, 2016, the Court addressed the class 2 misdemeanor charge of possession of drug paraphernalia. It was further ordered that BAKER must pay the following: \$66 in court costs; \$150 in fines; and court-appointed attorney fees in the amount of \$368.00.

Criminal History Synopsis:

This felony file was resolved with BAKER pleading guilty to a class two misdemeanor.
