### **Case Synopsis:**

On or between January 15 through February 6, 2016, FISHER was ordered to wear a drug patch. When the drug patch was tested, the results indicated a positive result for the use of methamphetamine at a level of 1151 ng/ml. This resulted a new criminal offense charge against FISHER for his continued felony behavior.

### **Original Sentencing Synopsis:**

On July 18, 2016, the Court addressed the class 5 felony for ingestion of a schedule 1 or 2 controlled substance. The Court considered the arguments of the State and the Defense prior to sentencing FISHER. The Court Ordered that FISHER shall receive a suspended 5-year sentence to the SD state penitentiary. The Court Ordered that FISHER satisfy a 4-year term of supervised probation. The Court ordered that FISHER serve 7-days in the Union County Jail. The Court then gave FISHER credit for the 7 days he spent incarcerated prior to the sentencing hearing. The Court Ordered that FISHER shall pay the following monetary obligations: \$104 in Court Costs; \$500 in fines; and \$54 in Court-Appointed Attorney Fees back to Union County. The Court ordered that this sentence shall run concurrent with FISHER's sentence in file 14-361.

### **Criminal History:**

This is Keith Fisher's second career felony conviction. FISHER's criminal history includes 2 DUI convictions; misdemeanor offense of Theft; and a felony Ingestion of a schedule 1 or 2 controlled substance.
